



DAY IN THE LIFE OF A KCA STUDENT

Students start arriving at KCA between 8:15 and 8:30, where our teachers and staff are ready at the door with good mornings. Once inside, they head to their first class of the day. Each class lasts 55 minutes, but no two days look exactly the same thanks to our rotating schedule.

Instead of a bell, our teachers personally dismiss their classes, creating a calmer, more connected transition between subjects.

Lunch starts at 11:25 and runs until noon, followed by a Crew before the afternoon classes begin. The school day wraps up at 3:30, except on Wednesdays, when students are dismissed at 12:30.



SCHEDULING & CLASS SELECTION

Daily Schedule: The school day starts at 8:30 am Monday-Friday and ends at 3:30 pm on Monday, Tuesday, Thursday and Friday. On Wednesdays, school ends at 12:30. Wednesday afternoons are used for staff meetings and staff development.

Class Schedule: KCA has a rotating schedule for morning classes, with each class meeting four times a week. The afternoon classes have a set schedule, but still meet four times a week because we do not have afternoon classes on Wednesday.

Class Selection: Students meet with an advisor in the spring to review their credit tally, identify the classes they still need to take, and/or determine the credits they are missing. During this meeting, students will rank their preferences for any elective classes they would like to take in addition to their required courses. The student and their advisor will complete a class selection document, and a copy will be made for the student to bring home for their parent/guardian to review and sign. This copy will be brought back to school and used to help create the class schedule for the upcoming school year.

- Electives- 6 Credits minimum



PARENT BOARD MEMBERS
